This book expands upon the use of technical indicators by studying and charting the most commonly traded currency pairs. Featuring numerous historical charts generated by proprietary software and charting system, it provides forex traders with a graphical interpretation of the markets, enabling them to see patterns, and to enter into and exit positions with confidence.

This is Vince's fourth book about trading and money management, and in it he combines most of the import parts of the first three and then presents some new insights. The first part of the book is conceptual on portfolio construction in terms of optional position sizing. It then takes you from basic gambling theory and statistics through more and more advanced portfolio models. It is not all about trading. It is about mathematical laws and how they affect us when we enter a stream of risk-related outcomes over which we have no control.

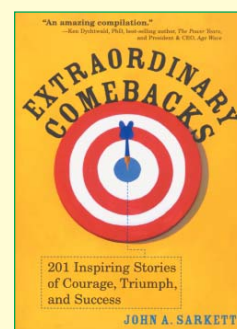
